Types of study:

UVSQ offers a wide variety of degrees and programs to suit your interests. These include undergraduate degrees (2 or 3 years), professional degrees, and master's degrees.

Bachelor's degrees

A bachelor's degree (BA/BSc), **called a *licence* in French, is a three-year undergraduate degree.** To apply for the first year of a UVSQ bachelor's program or Medical School program, please visit one of these links:

DUT

The DUT is a two-year university degree in technology. It has direct relevance in the workplace and includes both vocational and academic training with work placements and supervised projects. - » If you are living in France, apply through <https://www.parcoursup.fr/> between mid-January and mid-March
- » If you are living outside of France and your country has a dedicated Campus France site (check here), you must apply online through Campus France

Second or third year of bachelor's program, first or second year of master's program

If you are interested in applying for the second or third year of a bachelor's program or the first year of a master's program, you can do so:

French Immigration

If you are not French and your country is not part of the European Union you will need a visa to study in France. Visas are provided by the French Consulates and you should search the website of your local consulate to find out how to obtain a long-term student visa. For countries with a dedicated Campus France website ([check here](#)), you need to take preliminary steps through "Études en France".

French as a foreign language and the UVSQ Language Center

UVSQ offers a number of French as a foreign language courses through the UVSQ Language Center (CEREL), responsible for teaching modern languages.

The UVSQ Language Centre provides resources and services for members of the University who use foreign languages for study, research or personal interest. It also offers French courses for international students and staff. The cost of one-on-one lessons and language practice starts at €47 per semester.

Libraries

Our students have access to the UVSQ libraries' permanent collections of books and journals, and can also order items from other libraries.

Health Care and Social Security

All UVSQ students are required to join the French student social security scheme, which provides basic health insurance. It is strongly recommended that you also take out additional health insurance. Living at UVSQ

Housing:

Students who have been selected to spend a semester or a year at UVSQ may request on-campus housing through the Housing Office. The Housing Office can also help you search for private housing.
